Number of projects using funds for staff: **13** (100% of all projects reporting)

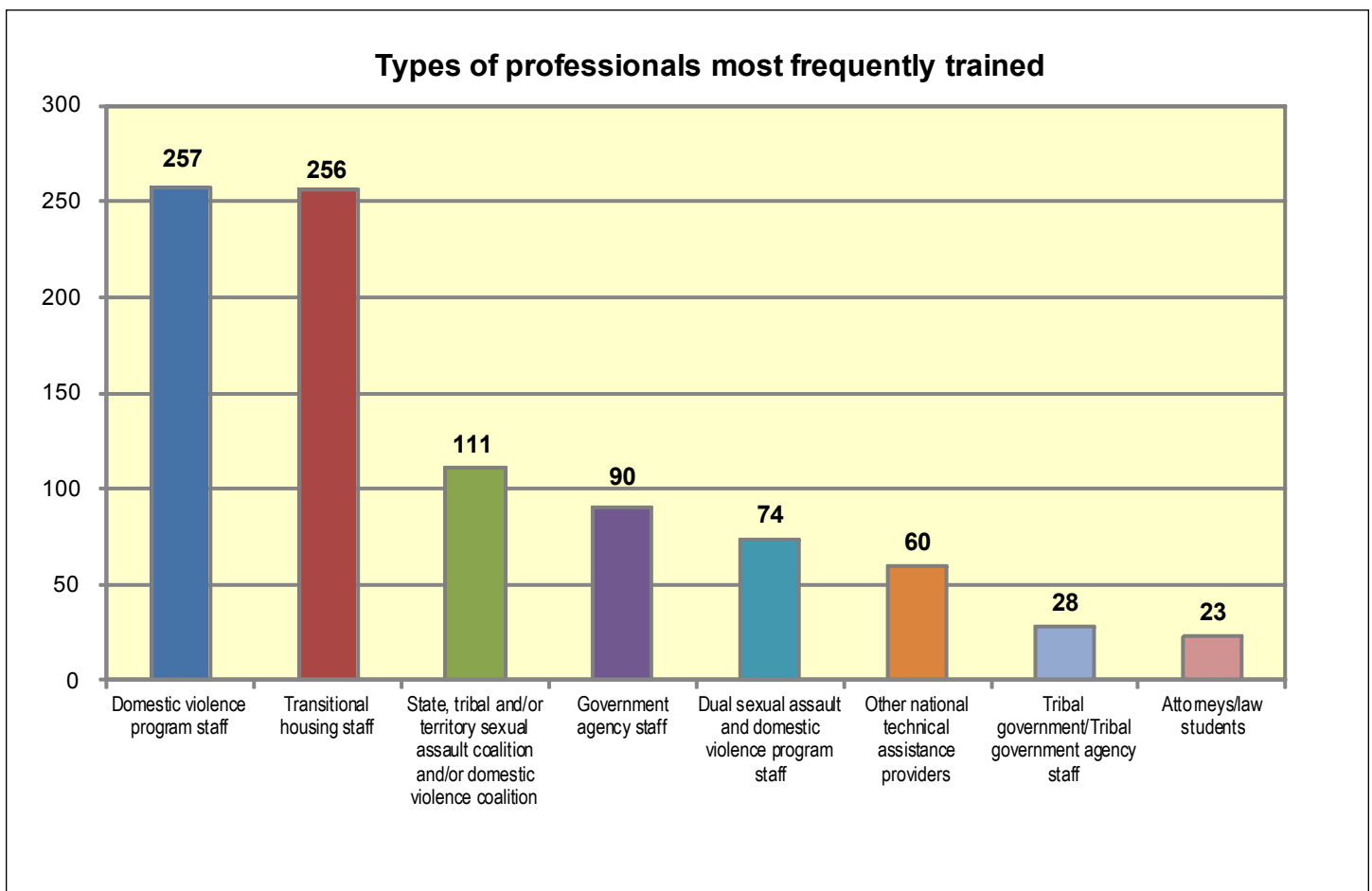

Number of training events: **43**

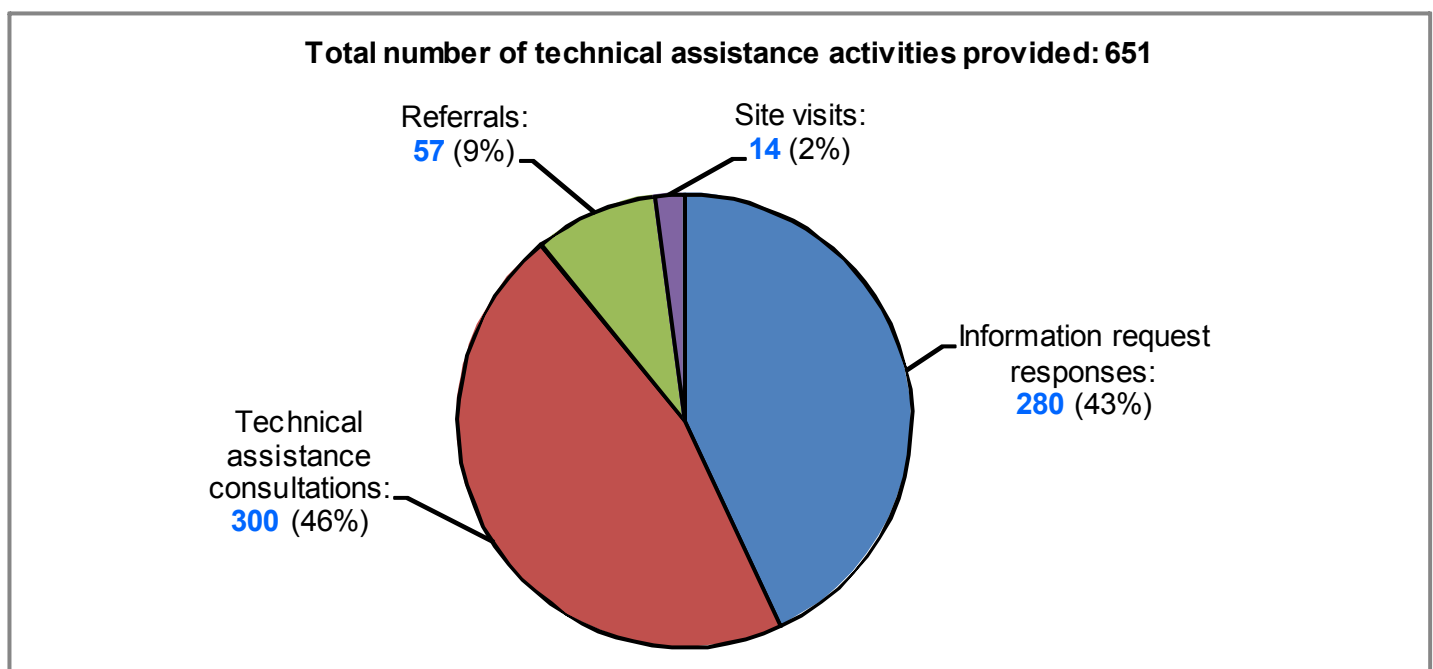
