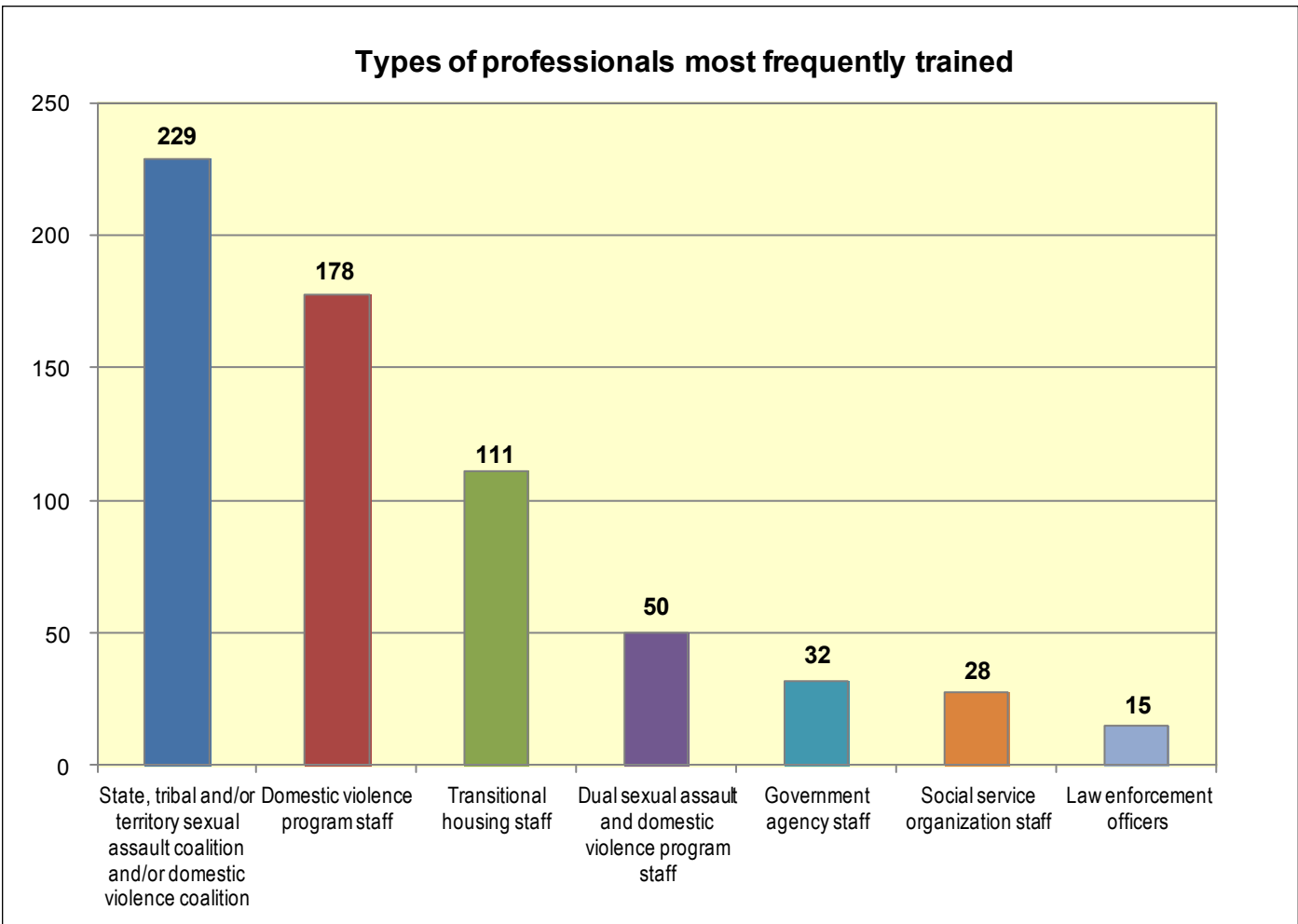

Number of training events: **28**



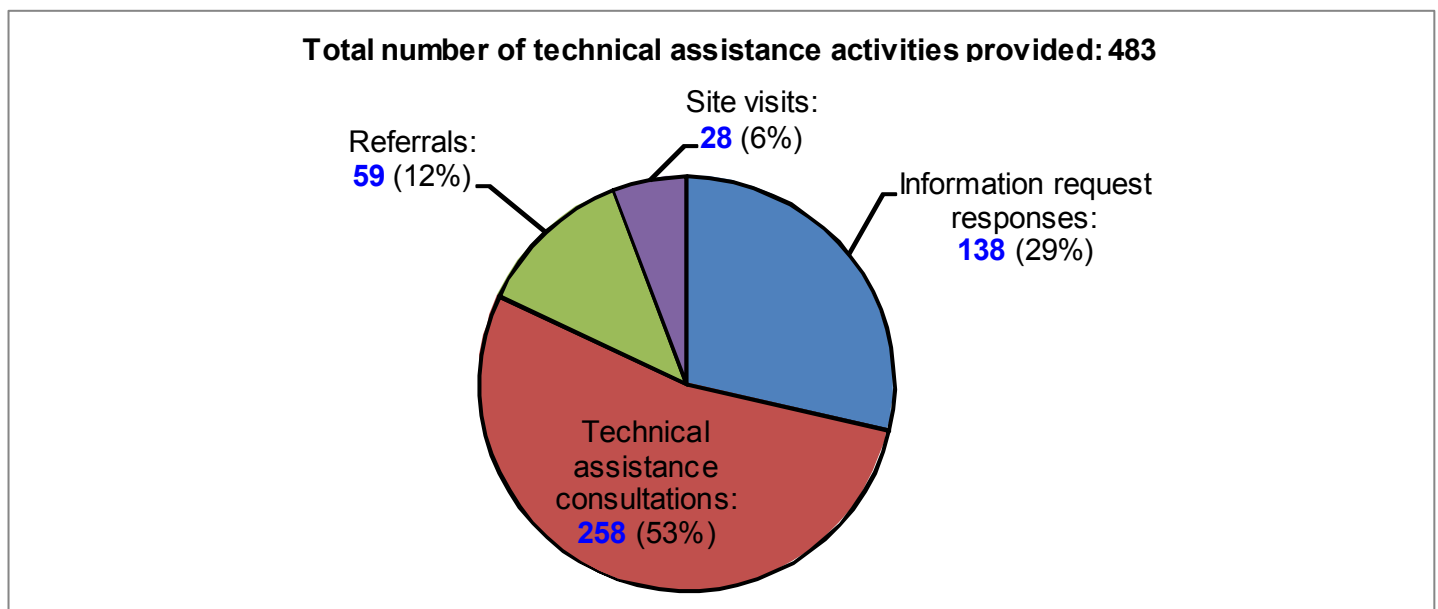
