

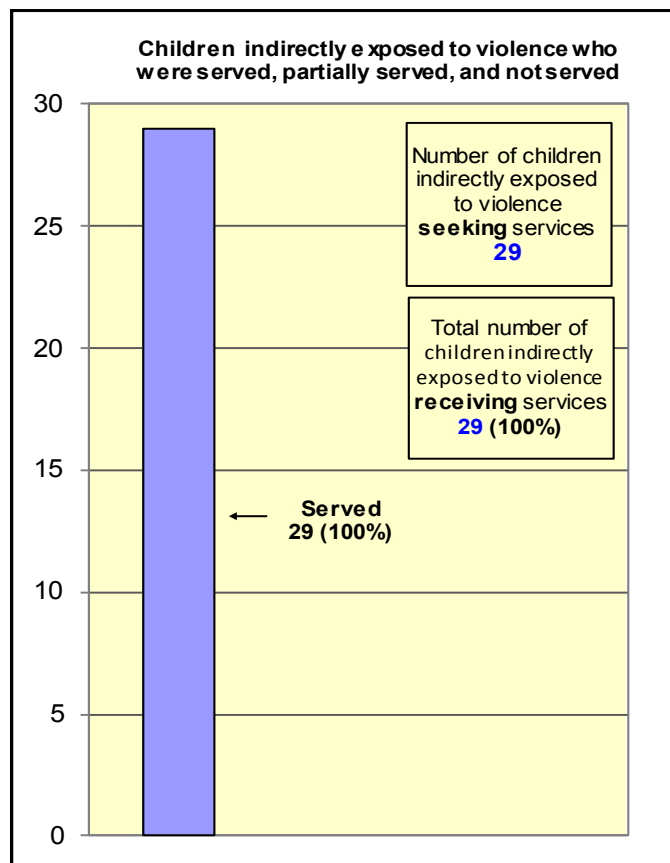


Consolidated Youth Program funds are used to develop, expand, and strengthen prevention strategies and intervention services that target children, youth and young adults who are victims of and/or exposed to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, including support for non-abusing parents and caretakers. They are also used to develop, maintain, or enhance programs that work with men to prevent sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking by helping men serve as role models and social influencers of other men and youth at the individual, school, or community levels.

Victim Services: Consolidated Youth Program grantees provided services to **1** child victim² and **29** children indirectly exposed to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking to help them become and remain safe from violence.

Number of grantees using funds for victim services: **1** (4% of all grantees reporting)

Victim Services and Demographics: Consolidated Youth Program grantees provide an array of services to child victims and children indirectly exposed to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. These services include child advocacy (actions designed to help the child obtain needed resources or services), counseling, crisis intervention, and legal advocacy (assistance navigating the criminal and/or legal system). Children also receive safety planning, referrals, and information as needed.

Children indirectly exposed to violence who were served or partially served by type of victimization:

- Domestic violence: **29** (100% of those receiving services)

Number of children indirectly exposed to violence receiving the following services:

Child advocacy: **29** (100% of those receiving services)

Counseling services: **17** (59%)

Education advocacy: **9** (31%)

Parent-child counseling or treatment intervention: **3** (10%)

Crisis intervention: **1** (3%)

³ Percentages are based only on those children receiving services for whom this information was known.

⁴ Some children indirectly exposed to violence may identify with more than one race/ethnicity, so the total number reported in race/ethnicity may be higher than the total number of victims/survivors served.

⁵ Because children indirectly exposed to violence be represented in more than one of these categories, or not at all, the total reported for this category may be higher or lower than the total number of children served.

⁶ Children indirectly exposed to violence may have been exposed to more than one offender and/or may have been exposed to more than one type of victimization, so the total for each victimization category may be higher than the total number of children served in each of these categories. Percentages are based on the total number of known relationships in each victimization category.

Support for non-abusing parents/caregivers: Consolidated Youth Program grantees provide support and/or referrals to non-abusing parents/caregivers of children who are receiving services.

Shelter services:

- **17** non-abusing parents/caregivers and **25** accompanying family members received a total of **1,010** emergency shelter bed nights.

Staff: Consolidated Youth Program staff provide victim services, and engage in prevention activities to increase safety for children and youth experiencing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

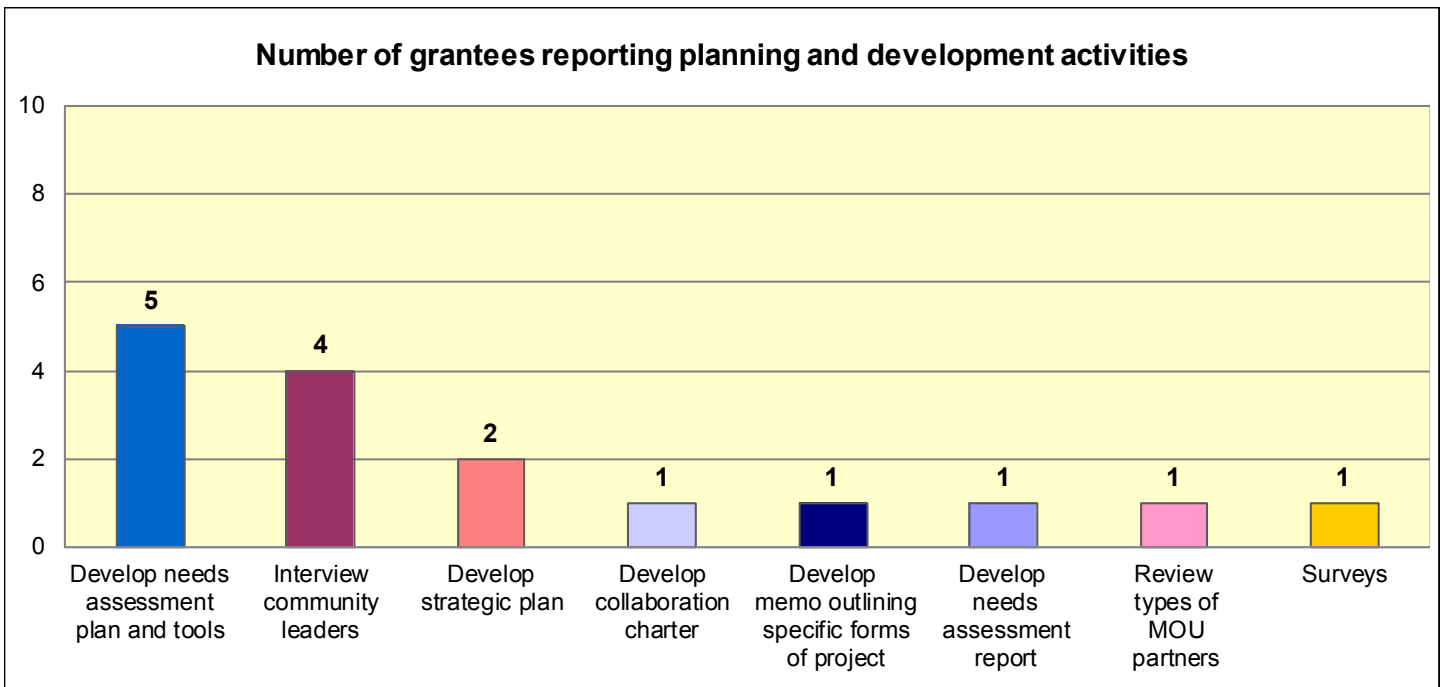
