Engaging Men and Youth in Preventing Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking Grant Program (Engaging Men and Youth Program)¹

The primary purpose of the Engaging Men and Youth Program is to support programs that encourage children and youth to pursue nonviolent relationships and reduce their risk of becoming victims or perpetrators of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, and to create public education campaigns and assist in community organizing to encourage men and boys to work as allies with women and girls to prevent domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

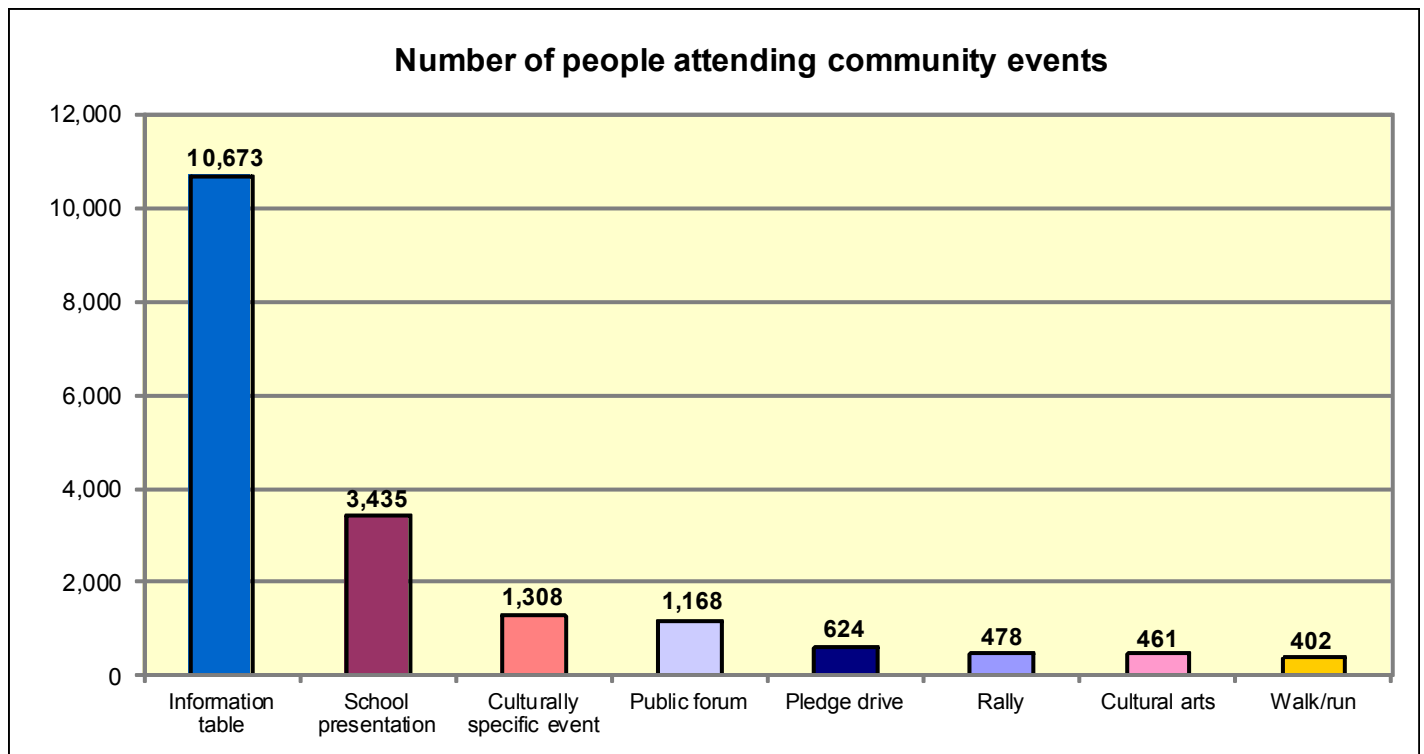

Number of people who attended events: **18,978**

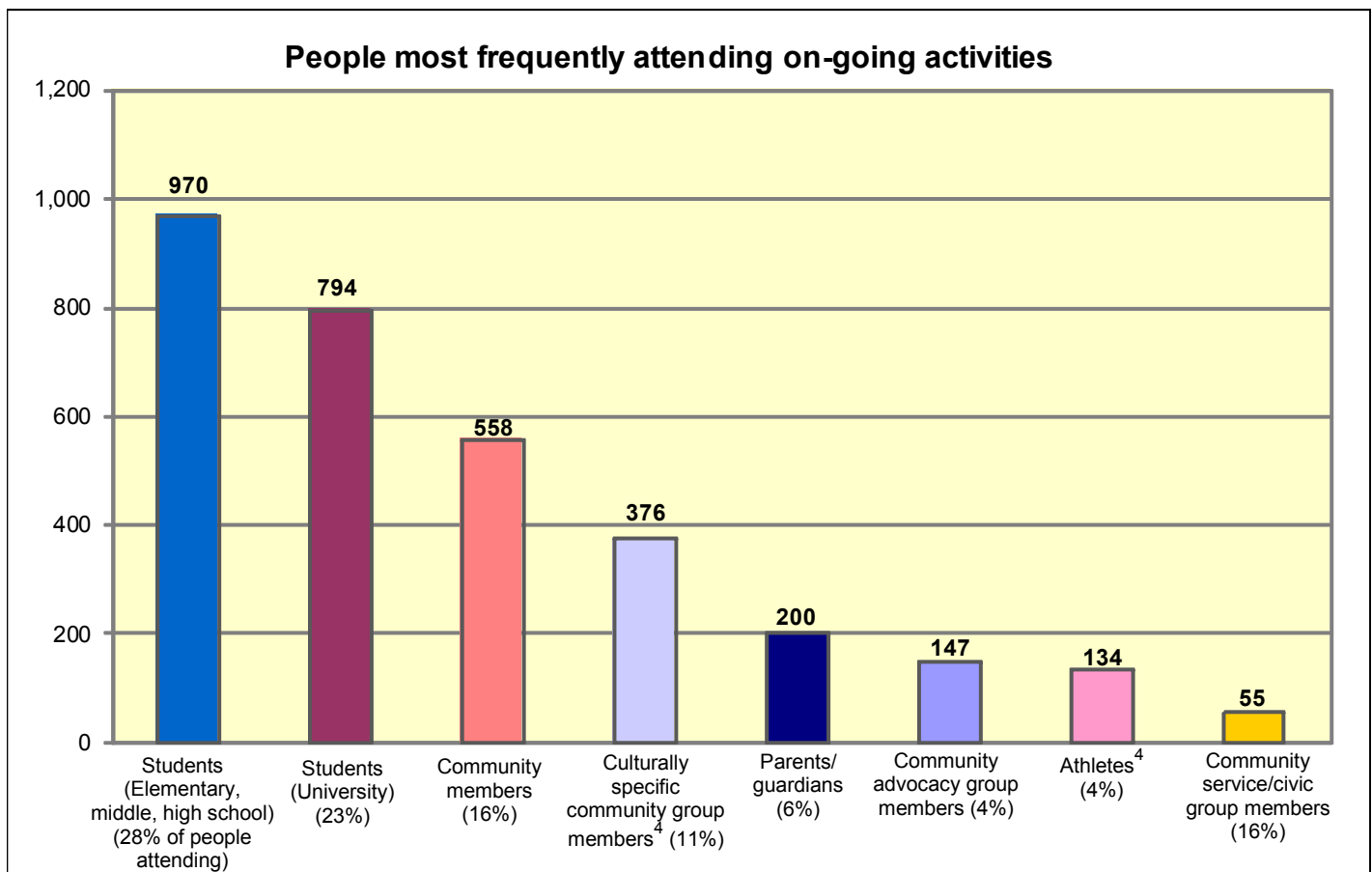
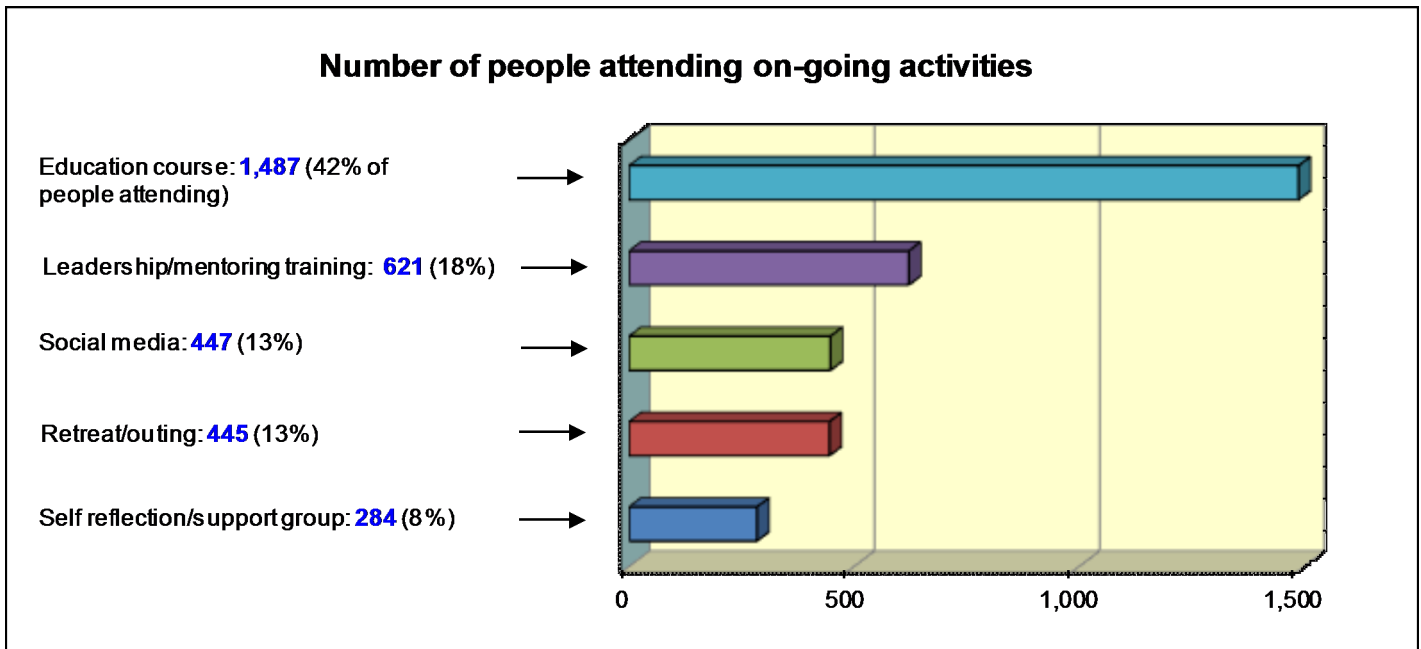

Number of people who attended ongoing (multi-session) activities: **3,521**



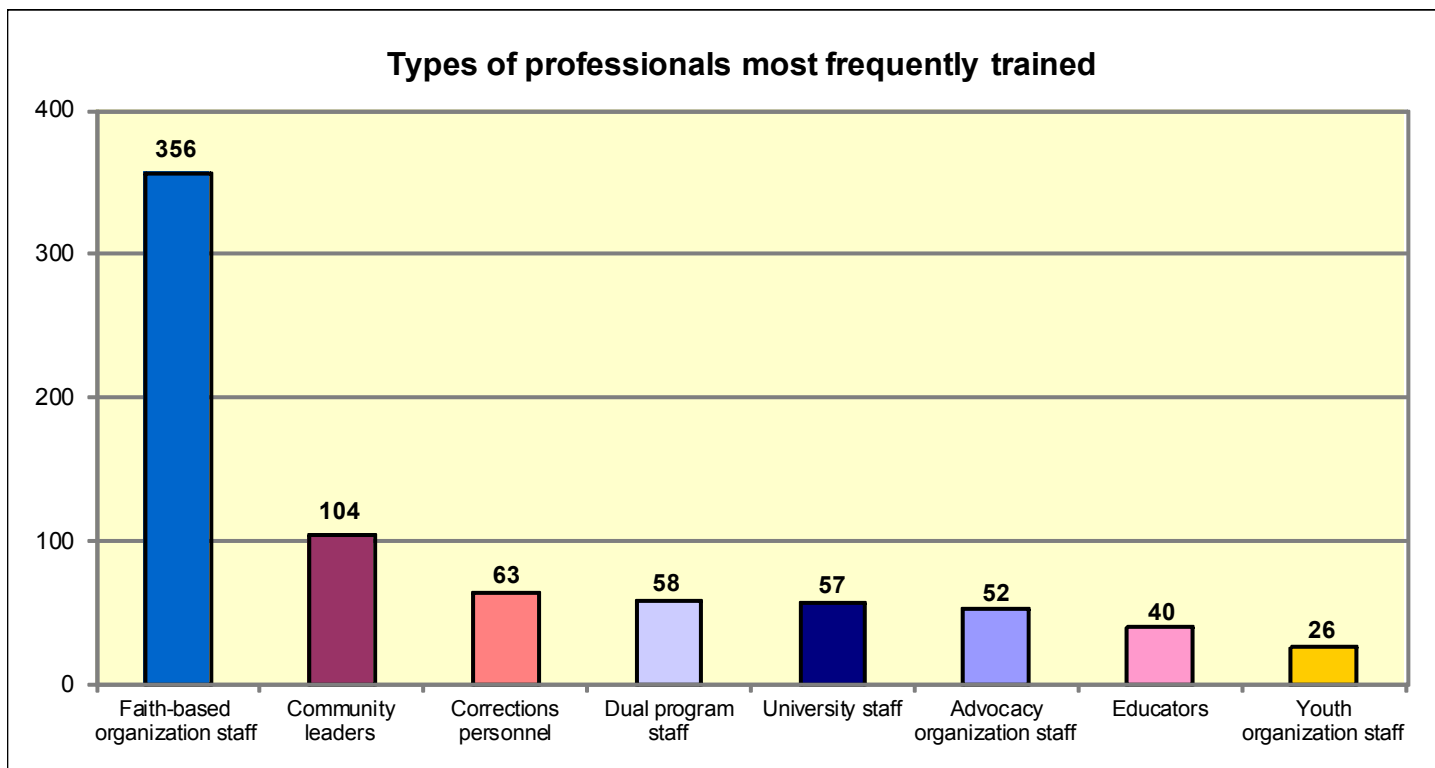

Training: Engaging Men and Youth Program grantees train professionals to improve the response to victims/survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, as it relates to their role in the system.

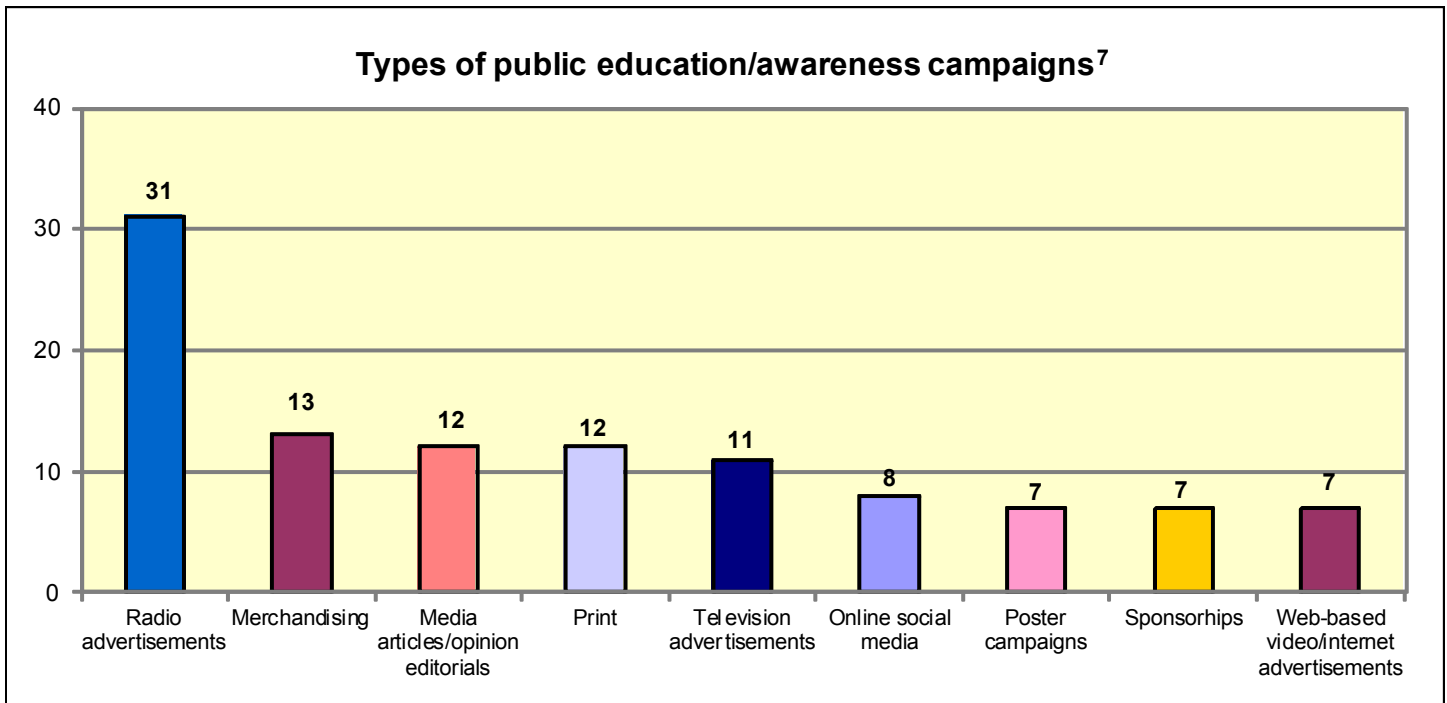

Public Education/Awareness Campaigns: Engaging Men and Youth Program create and utilize public education campaign to encourage men and boys to work as allies with women and girls to prevent domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

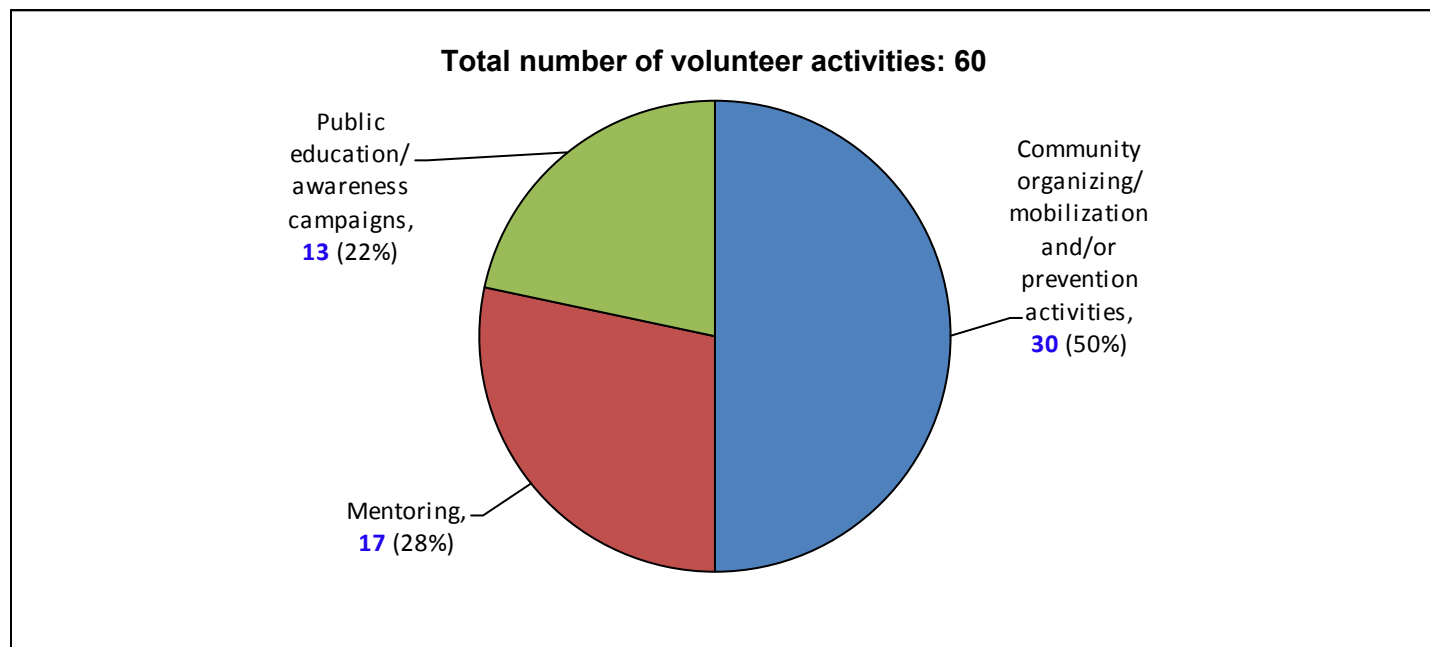

Volunteer activities: Engaging Men and Youth Program staff recruit, train, and utilize volunteers to assist in engaging men and boys to work as allies with women and girls to prevent domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

Total number of grantees using funds for volunteer activities: **6** (26% of all grantees reporting)

Total number of volunteers recruited: **138**

Total number of volunteers trained: **112**



Staff: Engaging Men and Youth Program staff provide training, public education, and community organizing to encourage men and boys to work as allies with women and girls to prevent domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

Total number of grantees using funds for staff: **23** (100% of all grantees reporting)
