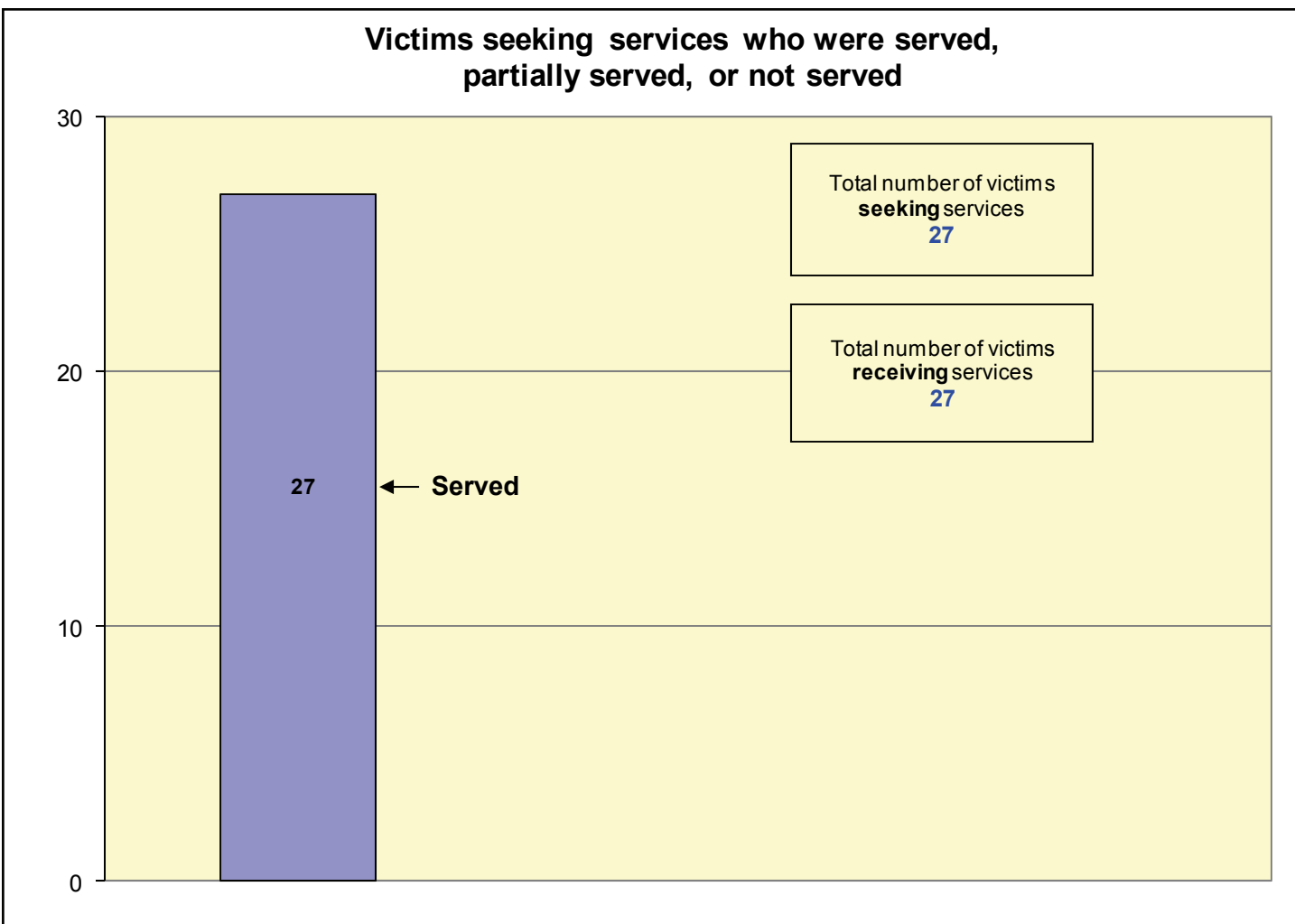

Sexual Assault Services Program Grants to Culturally Specific Programs  
Violence Against Women Grant Program  
Report Period: January 1-June 30, 2010**

The purpose of the Sexual Assault Services Culturally Specific Grant Program (SASP Culturally Specific Grant Program) is to create, maintain, and expand sustainable sexual assault services provided by culturally specific organizations, which are uniquely situated to respond to the needs of sexual assault victims within culturally specific populations.

**Victim Services:** SASP Culturally Specific Grant Program grantees provided services to **27** victims of sexual assault.



**Victim services and demographics:** SASP Culturally Specific Grant Program grantees provided an array of services to victims of sexual assault including victim advocacy (actions designed to help the victim/survivor obtain needed resources or services), counseling/support group, crisis intervention, and legal advocacy (assistance navigating the criminal and/or legal system). Victims/survivors receive safety planning, referrals, and information as needed.

 Crisis intervention: **11** (41%)

 Criminal justice advocacy/court accompaniment: **3** (11%)  
 Hospital/clinic/other medical response: **2** (7%)
