Number of projects using funds for staff: **135** (94% of all projects reporting)

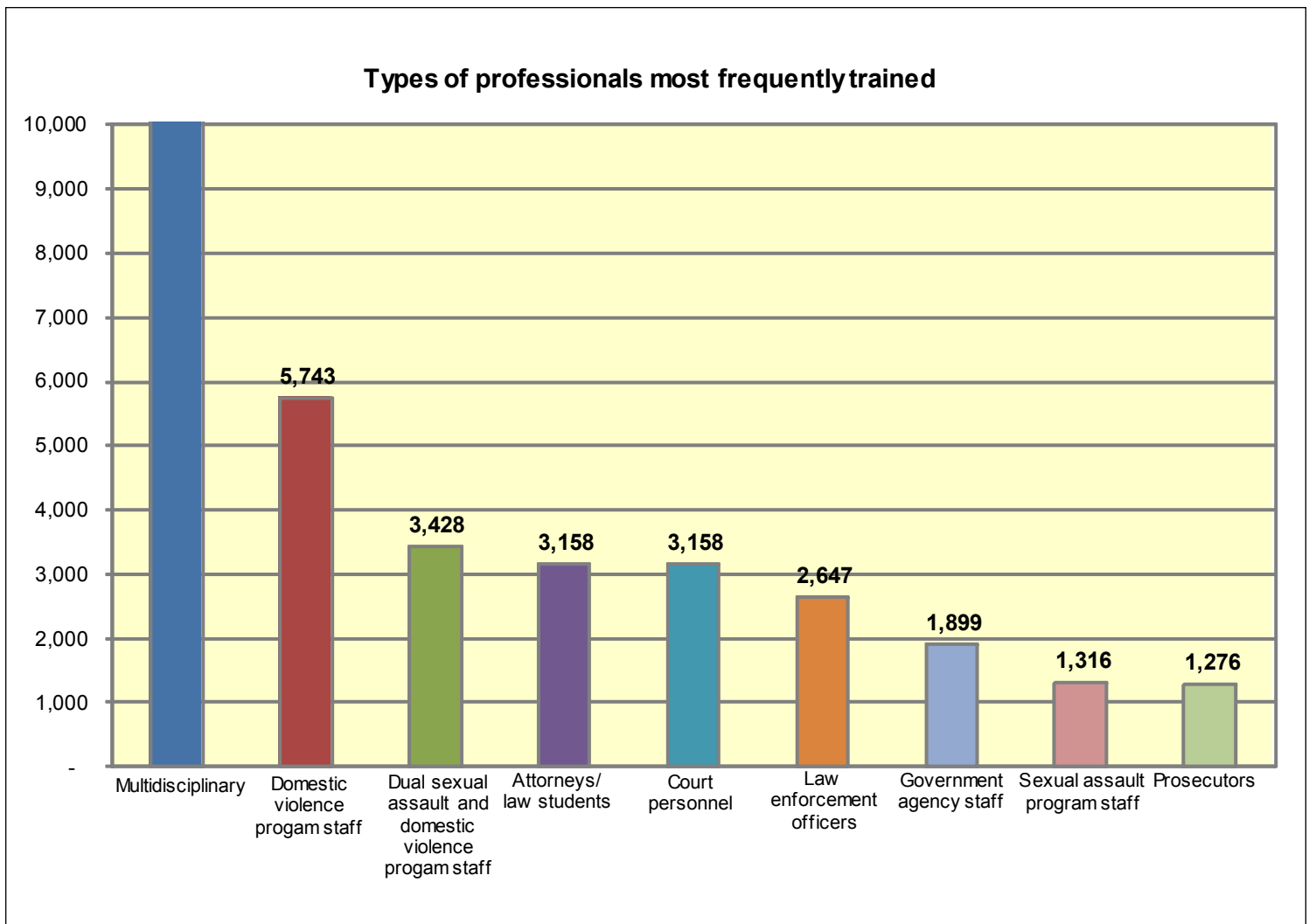
Total number of full-time equivalent staff funded: **244**

Number of training events: **855**

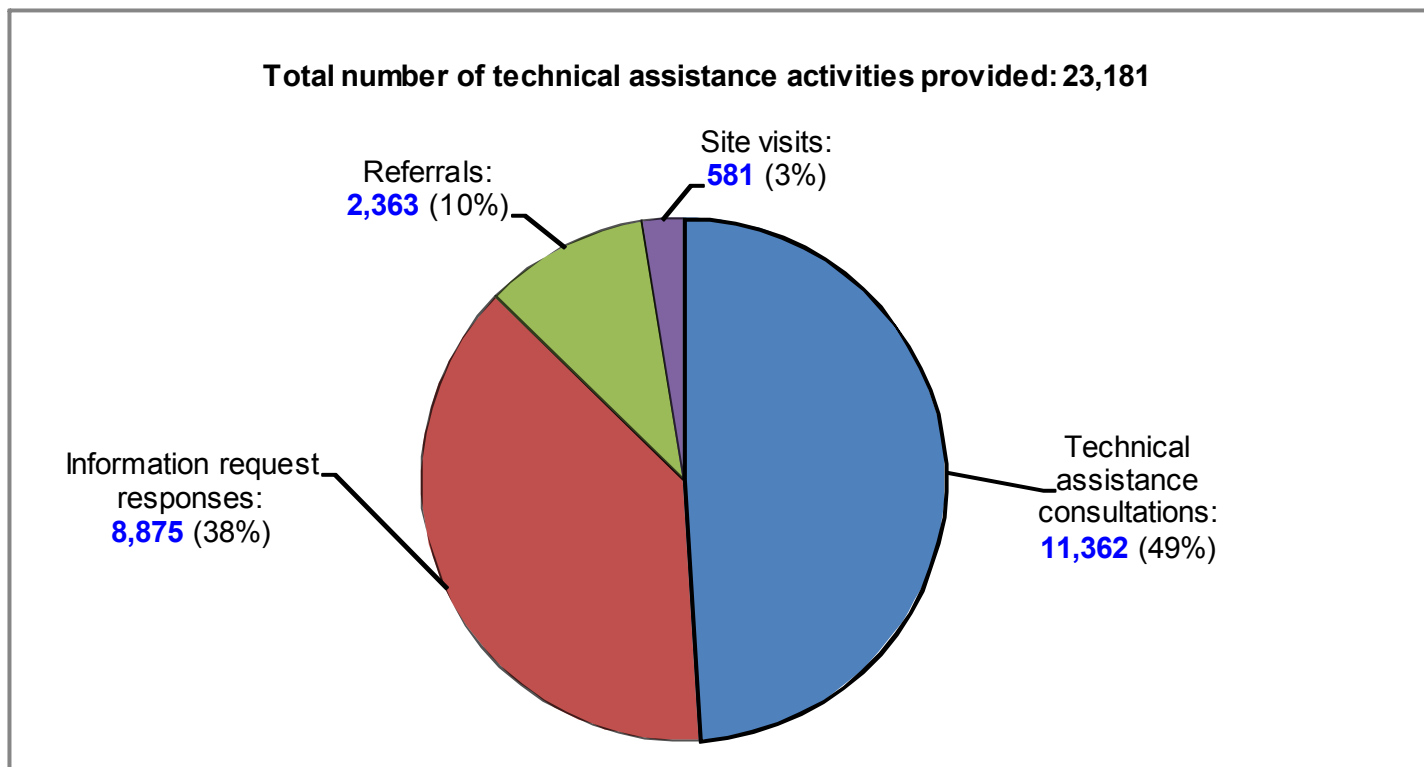
