Number of projects using funds for staff: **171** (97% of all projects reporting)

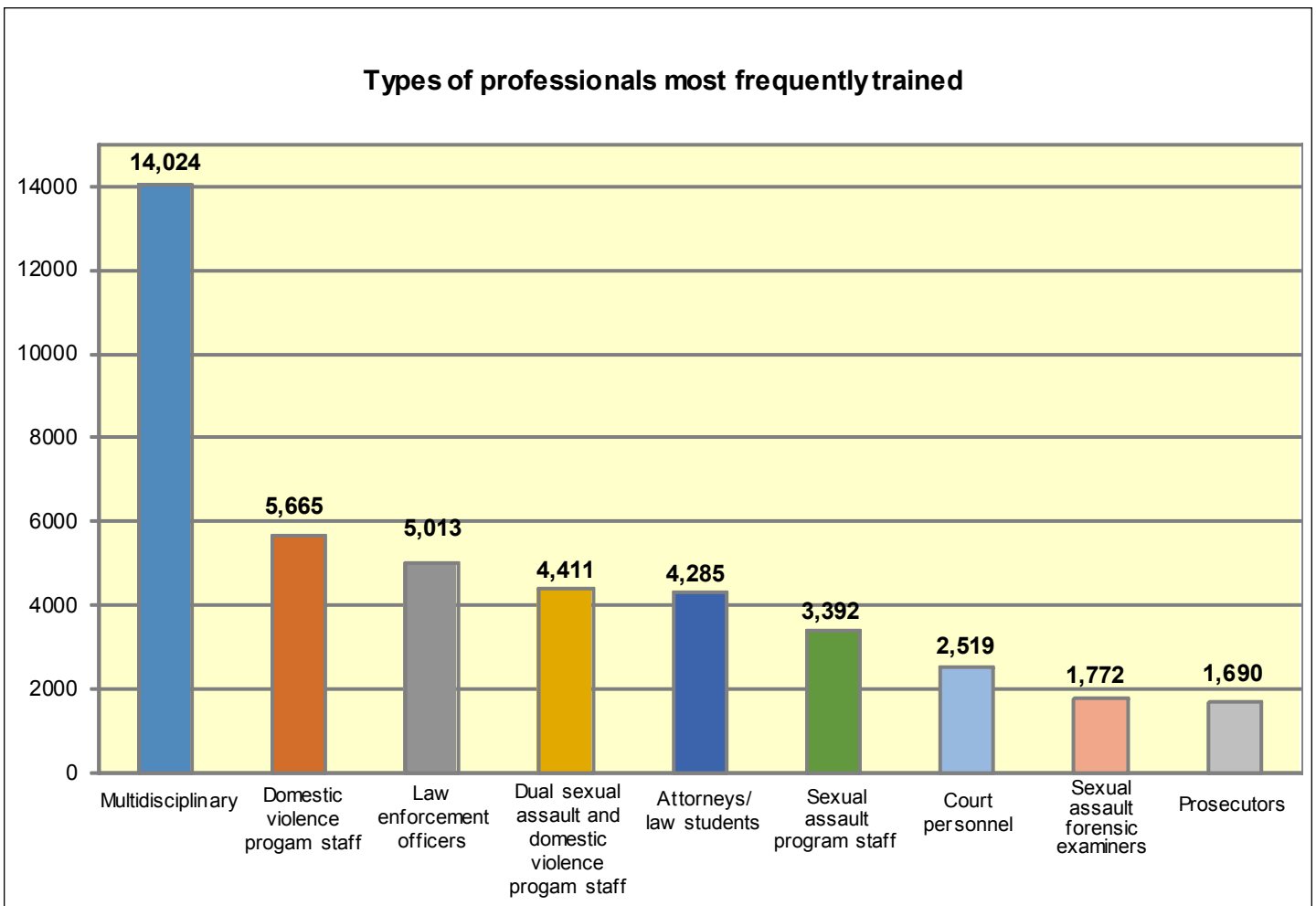
Total number of full-time equivalent staff funded: **295**

Number of training events: **1,008**

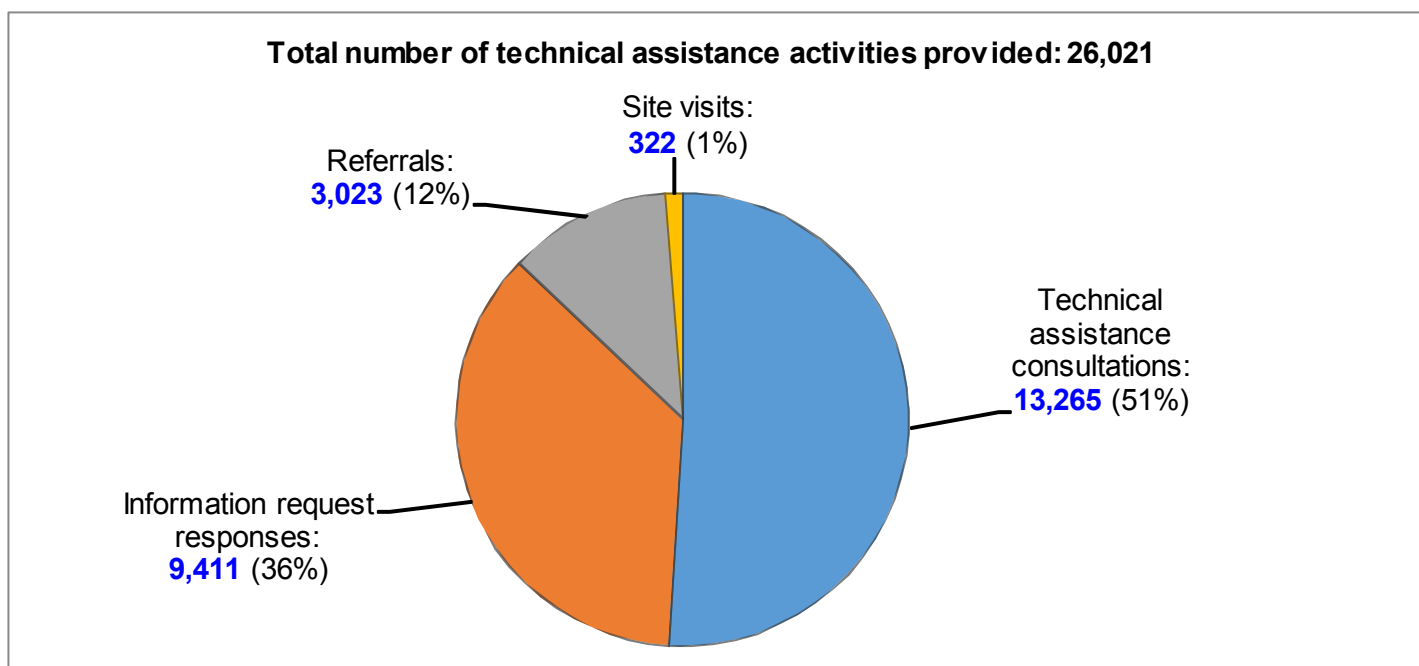
