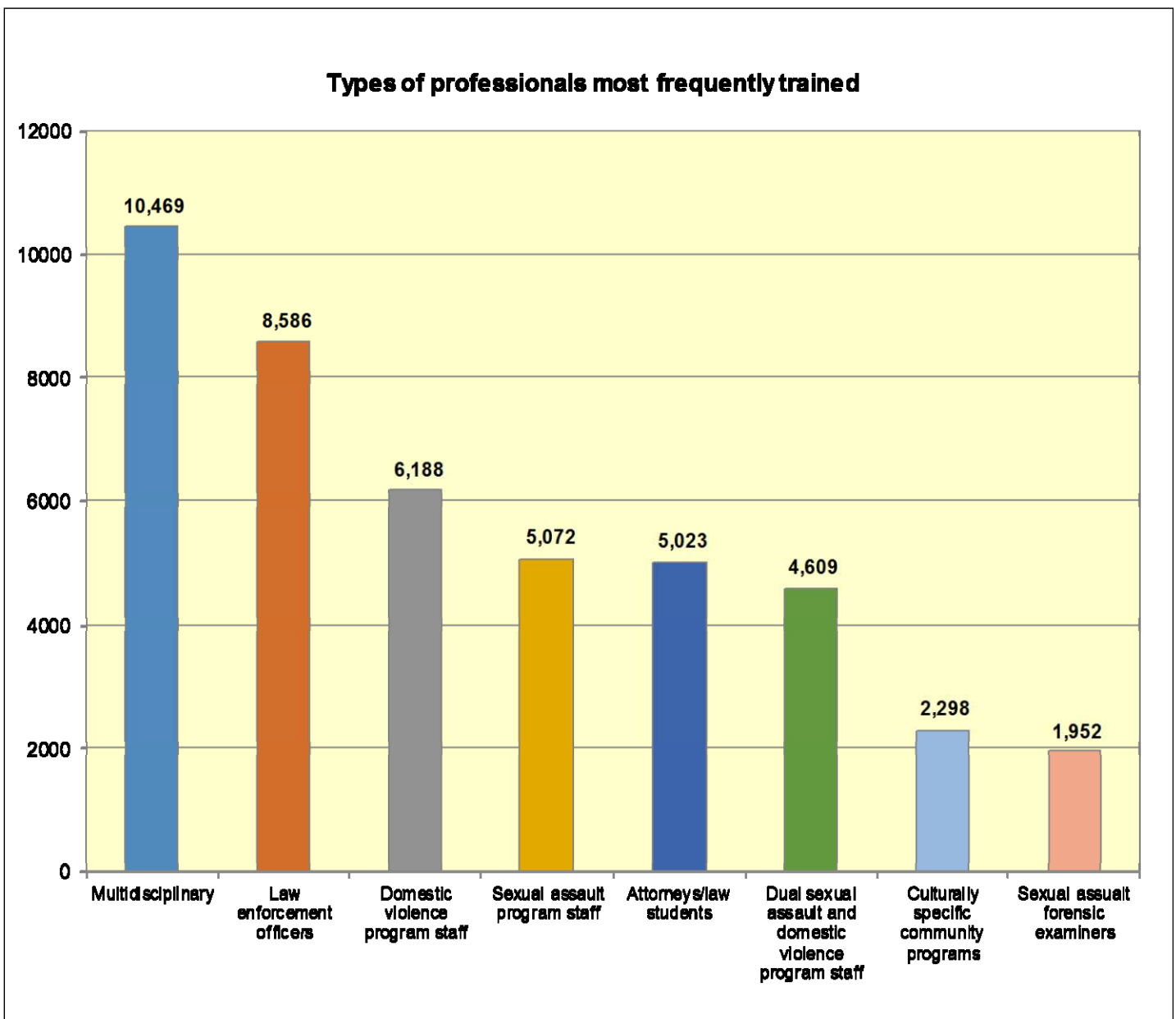

Number of training events: **1,009**

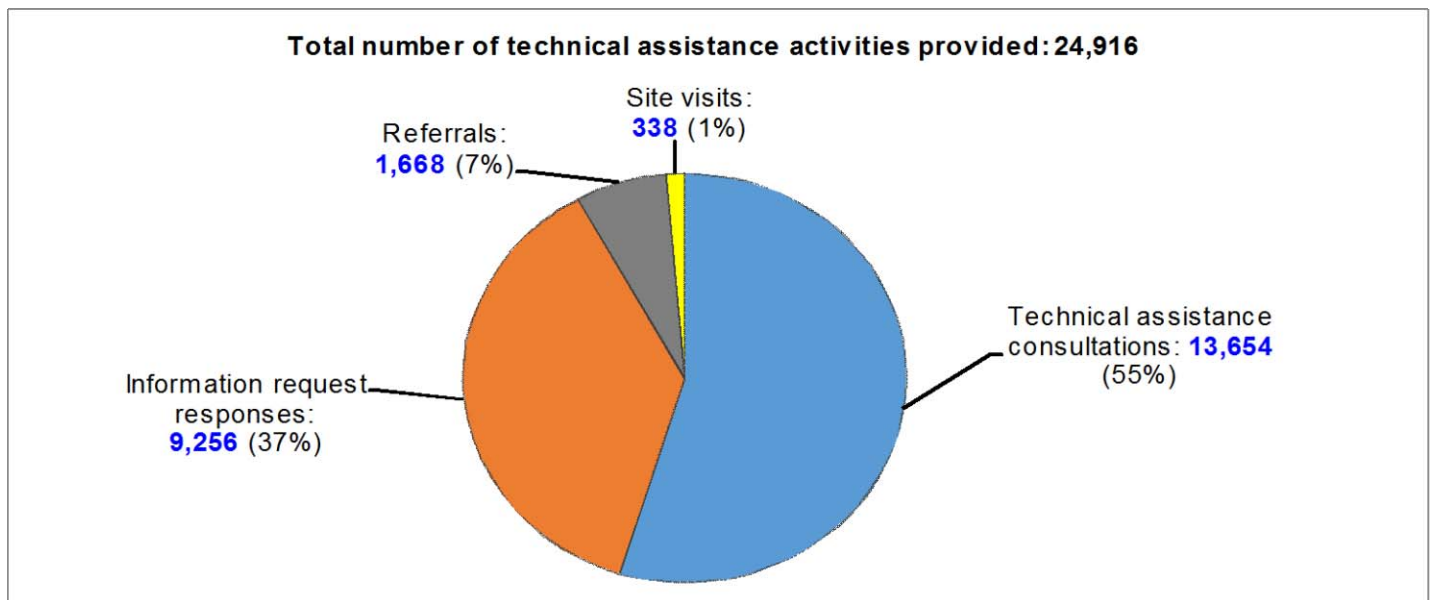
