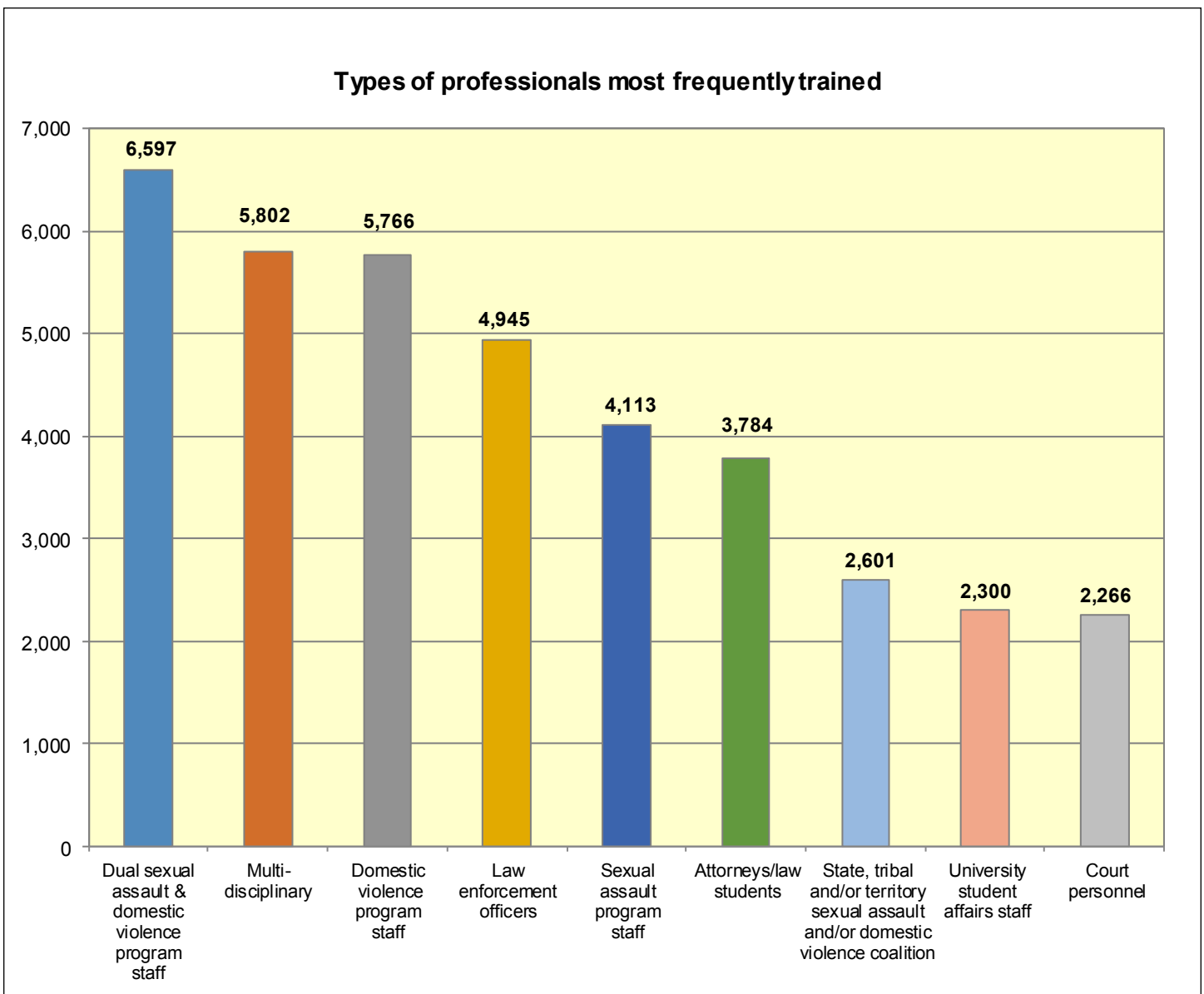

Number of training events: **1,090**

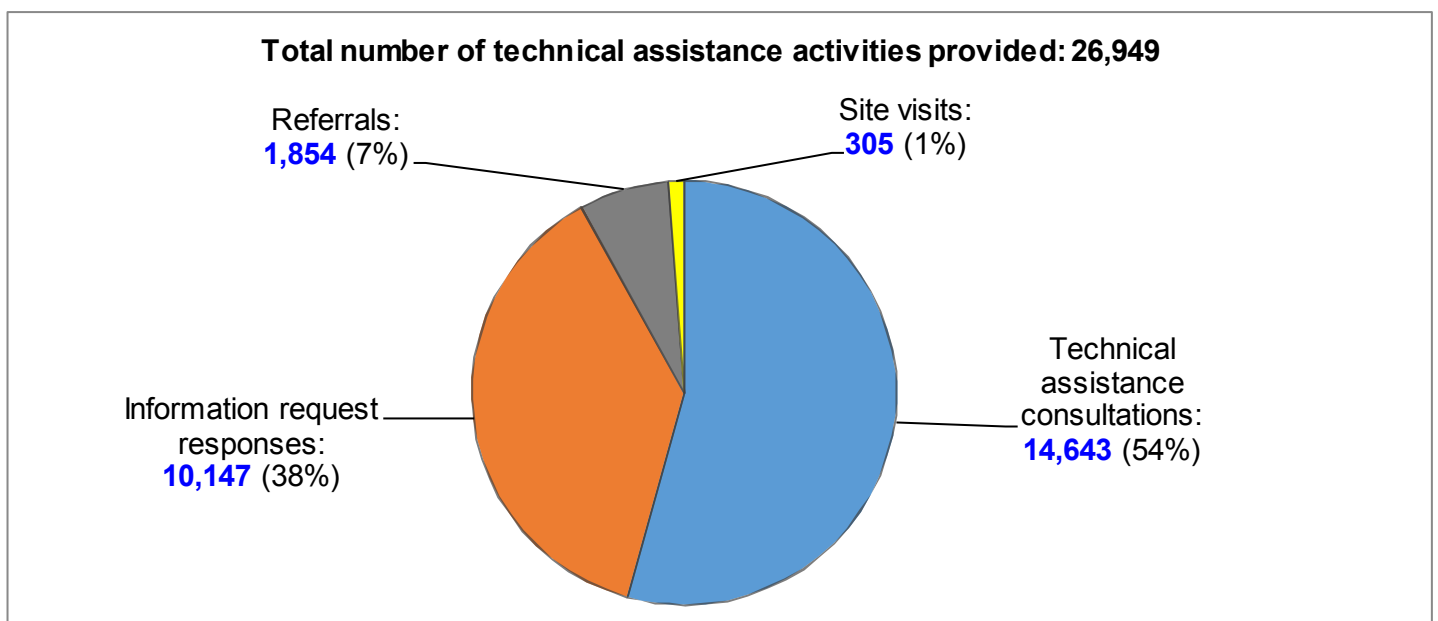
