Question 5. Type of lead agency/organization

- UPDATE: Added of "Tribal coalition" and three "State coalition" categories

> NEW Question 5a. Type of government partner

 If lead agency is a coalition or a victim services provider, check the government type(s) that best describe your project partners

Section B: Purpose Areas

Question 10. Statutory purpose areas

- Check all purpose areas that apply to activities supported with your ICJR Program funds during the current reporting period
- UPDATE: Carefully review the purpose areas, as they have been updated to reflect the changes made by the VAWA reauthorization of 2013

Section C1:Training

Question 13. People trained

 Removed "Military command staff" and "Multidisciplinary" categories

Question 14. Training Content Areas

- Justice System: Added "Homicide prevention (lethality assessment)" and "Sexual assault evidence collection kits"
- Underserved: Added "are D/deaf or hard of hearing" and "are in correctional settings"

5 ICJR PROGRAM

Section C3: Policies and Legislation

Question 18. Policies

- Added the following categories:
 - HIV testing programs, counseling, and prophylaxis for victims/survivors of sexual assault
 - Homicide prevention (lethality assessment)
 - Sexual assault evidence collection kits
 - Victim/survivor notification and engagement

> NEW Question 19. Legislation and Policies

 Discuss activities related to the development or promotion of State, local, or tribal legislation and policies

ICJR PROGRAM

Section C4: Products

Question 21. Products

- Discuss the products that were developed and/or revised using funds during the reporting period
- UPDATE: "Training curricula" and "Training materials" have been combined into one "Training curricula and materials" category
- UPDATE: No longer reporting on the number of used/distributed products.
 - If funds only supported distributing/using of a product, you would not report it.

7 ICJR PROGRAM

Section C5: Data Collection and Communication Systems

Questions 22 & 23. Data collection & systems

- Discuss grant funds used to develop, install, or expand data collection and/or communications
- Check all that apply for both data collection and systems (q. 22) and purpose of data collection and systems (q. 23)
- UPDATE: Added "Sexual assault evidence collection kits" to Question 23

Section C7: System Improvement

- Question 26. System improvement
 - Data recorded here should describe improvements made that influence a broad, system-wide response
 - UPDATE: Added "Fatality review" and "Language access plan" categories

Section D:Victim Services

- Most of the data requested in this section is congressionally mandated
 - Congress wants to know how many of the victims/survivors seeking services were served and how many could not be served
- Provide information in this section that represents only those victims/survivors served and services provided with ICJR funds
- Report all grant-funded victim services provided, whether by a victim services organization, or by staff providing victim services within law enforcement, prosecution, or the court system.

Victim Services (cont.)

NEW Question 28. New victims/survivors served

- For each victim/survivor reported in 27A and 27B, report the number who began receiving ICJR Program-funded services during the current reporting period
- If this is your first reporting period using ICJR funds, all victims/survivors reported in 27A and 27B should be reported in Question 28

11 ICJR PROGRAM

Victim Services (cont.)

> NEW Question 29. Additional victimizations

- For each victim reported in question 27A or 27B, report any additional types of victimizations for which they received ICJR Program-funded services during the current reporting period
- Discuss additional types of victimizations victims/survivors received services for, including trafficking

Victim Services (cont.)

Question 30. Reasons not served/partially served

- Check all that apply, indicating whether the reason applies to victims/survivors partially served, not served, or both
- UPDATE: Revised table has two columns of check boxes one for partially served and one for not served

13 ICJR PROGRAM

Victim Services (cont.)

Question 31. demographics updates

- Race/ethnicity: Added "Some other race, ethnicity, or origin" category
- Gender: Added "Transgender or gender noncomforming" category
- Age: "13-17" category changed to "11-17"
- Other demographics:
 - Added "Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ) individuals"
 - Added "People who are D/deaf or hard of hearing"

Victim Services (cont.)

Question 33a. victim services

- For victims/survivors reported in 27A and 27B, report the number that received each type of service offered
- UPDATE: Added "Number of times service was provided" column
 - For example, if 10 victims each received counseling 3 times during the current reporting period, report 30 in the 'number of times service was provided'
- UPDATE: Added "Forensic exam" category

15 ICJR PROGRAM

Section E1: Law Enforcement

Question 36. Law Enforcement Activities

- Report the number of ICJR Program-funded activities related to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and/or stalking cases/incidents for the current reporting period
- UPDATE: Added "Forensic medical exam" category, only applicable to sexual assault activities
- UPDATE: Changed the "Referrals of federal firearms charges to federal prosecutor" category to "Referred for federal prosecution"

.6 ICJR PROGRAM

Section E2: Prosecution

- Question 40a. Law Enforcement Activities
 - Report the number of cases received, accepted for prosecution, decline, transferred, or referred
 - UPDATE: Added "Referred for federal prosecution" category

17 ICJR PROGRAM

Section E3: Courts

- UPDATE: No longer collecting data on the number of new criminal cases
- Question 49. Dispositions of violations
 - Report the number of cases in which there were dispositions of violations during the current reporting period
 - The violation does not have to have occurred during this reported period, only the disposition
 - UPDATE: "Partial revocation of probation" and "Probation revoked/incarcerated" have been combined into one "Partial or full revocation of probation" category

18 ICJR PROGRAM

Section E4: Probation and Parole

Question 54. Number of offenders

- Report the number of offenders monitored by ICJR Programfunded staff during the current reporting period under the "Number of offenders" column
- UPDATE: "Number of continuing offenders" and "Number of new offenders" have been combined into one "Number of offenders" category

Question 55. Monitoring activities

- Discuss monitoring activities engaged in during the reporting period
- UPDATE: Addition of "Electronic monitoring (GPS, radio frequency)"

ICJR PROGRAM

Section E4 (cont.)

Question 56. Disposition of violations

- Discuss the number of cases in which there dispositions of violations during the current reporting period
- Violation does not have to have occurred during this reporting period, only the disposition. A case may be counted more than once if there were multiple violations.
- UPDATE: "Partial revocation of probation" and "Probation revoked/incarcerated" have been combined into one "Partial or Full revocation of probation" category

ICJR PROGRAM

Section E5: Batterer Intervention Program (BIP)

- Question 59. Offenders in program
 - Report the number of offenders in your BIP during the current reporting period
 - UPDATE: "Number of continuing offenders in BIP program" and "Number of new offenders in BIP program" have been combined into one "Number of offenders in BIP program" category
