VAWA MEI


- Violence Against Women Act Measuring Effectiveness Initiative (VAWA MEI)
 - Works closely with OVW and their grantees to document, measure and report on the work of VAWA-funded grants nationwide
 - VAWA MEI directly collects STOP and SASP Subgrantee data

New Web-Based Tool


MEI and OVW will launch a new, web-based tool in 2024.

Admin Report must be downloaded from the VAWA MEI website.

2024 Due Dates

- STOP Formula administrators will be asked to submit subgrantee data directly to VAWA MEI via the new progress reporting tool by June 30, 2024.
- Administrators need to download their reporting form from the MEI website and submit their administrators form as an attachment in **JustGrants** by **June 30, 2024**.

Administrator Responsibilities in Reporting Subgrantee Data

- STOP and SASP Program Administrators:
 - Answer subgrantee questions about how and what to report
 - Collect their state or territory's subgrantee reports from subgrantee agencies
 - Review each subgrantee report and addressing any errors or misunderstandings with the subgrantee
 - Submit approved subgrantee data to VAWA MEI

Administrator Abilities in the New Reporting System

- State Administrators will be able to:
 - Generate a blank subgrantee form link
 - Monitor the status of subgrantees' reports
 - View individual subgrantee reports
 - Generate a link for an individual subgrantee report
 - Download and delete subgrantee reports
 - Submit subgrantee data directly to VAWA MEI

Subgrantee Abilities in the New Reporting System

- Subgrantees will be able to:
 - Access a blank progress report via the link provided by the State Administrator
 - Save their progress, exit, and return later to continue working on it
 - Have more than one person access and edit their progress report
 - Submit their progress report data directly to their State
 Administrator

Get involved!

- > MEI will do user-testing in early 2024
 - Testers will provide feedback on the tool and how it works for them
- Stay tuned for this opportunity
 - MEI will send an email to formula administrators with an invitation to become a user-tester early next year

Progress Report Updates

- The 2022 VAWA Reauthorization expanded some OVW grant programs and revised or clarified certain definitions and grant conditions that cut across programs.
- OVW has revised the STOP and SASP Subgrantee Annual Progress Reports to reflect the changes made by VAWA 2022 and to improve the quality and utility of the data collected.

- Future resources
 - Separate training videos for STOP and SASP providing instruction on every question on the subgrantee progress reports.
 - Separate webinars for STOP and SASP Administrators walking through how to use the new reporting system and the data to be collected.

Subgrantee Progress Report Updates

Victim Demographics

New Race/Ethnicity Categories

- Middle Eastern or North African
- People of a race, ethnicity, or origin not listed

Gender

- Women or girls
- Men or boys
- Transgender
- Non-binary or non-conforming
- Two-Spirit
- A gender not listed
- Unknown

NOTE: Victims can be counted under **more than one** gender category.

STOP 2022 VAWA Reauthorization: Purpose Areas

- 1. Supporting programs, policies, and training to improve evidence collection for victims of four VAWA crimes, including funding for technology that better detects bruising and injuries across skin tones;
- 2. Supporting culturally specific victim programs to respond to female genital mutilation/cutting;
- 3. Providing victim advocates in state and local law enforcement agencies, prosecutors' offices, and courts to support Indian victims; and
- 4. Paying fees for furnishing victims and their children with new identity documents.

2022 STOP Subgrantee Progress Report Changes

Training

- Report on live training events, as well as the development of asynchronous training materials
- Community Education/Public Awareness
 - Report on live education events, as well as the development of PSAs or social media content
- Victim Services
 - Added female genital mutilation/cutting, per the VAWA 2022 reauthorization
- Case Investigations (aka Law Enforcement)
 - Reorganized section and added new questions related to Sexual Assault Kits and support for victims

SASP 2022 VAWA Reauthorization: Victim Service Types

- Clarifies that "Intervention and related support" may include direct payments to victims.
 - Added "Direct payments/financial assistance" service category to Victim Services
- VAWA programs that fund victim services can now provide grant-funded legal services.
 - "Legal Services" section to capture the work of grantfunded attorneys and paralegals
